- 1) On January 15th, 2022, at the close of the Mid-Winter Conference, National Vice Commander (NVC) Jeff Vrabel SR asked the Historian if he would create a memory book of his visit to Wisconsin. On January 18, the Historian created a "little book" of his visit. One copy was created and printed. The Wisconsin NEC Officer inscribed the inside cover and the book was sent off to the home of the NVC. This book was created, printed and shipped at the expense of the Historian as he did so as a volunteer.

Today, the Detachment Historian is presenting a second "little book" for the Detachment of Wisconsin's records. Receipt included for re-imbusement.

- 2) Homeless Veterans Awareness Projects 2022, Memory Book – VA&R

On February 11th and 12th, 2022, the Historian attended Squadron 294, Hartland "OPERATION HOMELESS VETERANS" Homeless Veteran's encampment. The event raised \$ 54,000 split two ways at \$27,000 each. Milwaukee Homeless Veteran's Initiative and Veteran's Outreach of Wisconsin Tiny Houses.

On March 19th 2022, the Historian attended Squadron 209, Orfordville FREEZIN FOR a REASON, Homeless Veteran's encampment. Roughly \$ 50,000 was earned on this three day event.

One Memory book was created to highlight what these two SAL Squadrons accomplishment. Today, the Detachment Historian is presenting two "memory books" for the Detachment of Wisconsin's records. Receipt included for re-imbusement. The Historian requests that one book be taken to Spring Meetings to show off what our Wisconsin SAL Squadrons are doing in support of Veterans.

History Contest Rules

The rules below apply to all Histories.

I. INTRODUCTION: (10 scoring points)

1. Title Page
 - a. History of Squadron
 - b. Name of Historian
 - c. Administrative Year (i.e. 2021-2022)
2. Foreword or Dedication
3. Picture (5 X 7), black and white or color of the Commander
4. Prayer
5. Pledge of Allegiance
6. Preamble to the Constitution of the Sons of The American Legion

II. HISTORICAL CONTENT: (50 scoring points)

1. List of elected officers of the Squadron
2. List of Squadron Committee Chairmen
3. List of any Detachment awards received at the previous year's Convention, or during the administrative year.
4. The History should be written as a narrative, beginning with the Installation of Officers and ending with the close of the year.
5. The signature of the Squadron Commander and Historian are to immediately follow the final paragraph of the history.

III. INDEX: (10 scoring points)

1. The Index should be the last page of the History, and must be in alphabetical order and double spaced.

IV. APPEARANCE: (15 scoring points)

1. The binder should be for loose leaf paper and have a Sons of The American Legion emblem on the cover.
2. The paper should be plain whit bond, 8 1/2 X 11.
3. All information should be typed or neatly handwritten, neatly spaced with no noticeable errors.

V. ARRANGEMENT: (10 scoring points)

1. Written in third person
2. Correct spelling
3. Original and different in thought and presentation
4. Clear and grammatically correct

VI. DEADLINE

1. All Histories must be received before Noon, Saturday of the Detachment Convention.
2. The entries should be submitted to the Detachment Adjutant.

Sons of The American Legion Community Affairs Commission

Official Scrapbook Contest Rules

1. Community Affairs Scrapbooks must be neat and in chronological order, encompassing an administrative year, from one Detachment Convention to the next Detachment Convention. Only activities and articles taking place in said administrative year may be submitted for judging.

2. All books to be considered for judging for the Community Affairs Commission Award must be submitted to the Detachment Adjutant, prior to the Detachment Convention.

If sent through the mail, it should be sent to Detachment Adjutant, Return receipt should be requested. **Scrapbooks must be submitted no later than Friday, noon of Convention.**

1. The articles, and other judging information contained in the scrapbook must be Community Affairs only. Guidelines are as follows:

A. Any publication in the newspaper relating to service provided, thank you letter from recipients of community service, or letters of acknowledgment. All submission must have proper dates indicating date which service was rendered.

B. Community Affairs is defined as any program or activity that directly benefits any person of the community or the community itself. It cannot be a project benefitting The American Legion or organizations within the scope of The American Legion.

2. All submissions must be properly bound to ensure that the pages are secure and will not become loose and fall out. The Commission takes no responsibility for books not adhering to this rule.

3. Scrapbooks may be submitted from and Squadron or District.

A. Submissions must identify the Squadron or District which it is from on the front cover of the scrapbook. All books must list a name and address to which the book can be returned. All books may be picked up after judging, except for the winner which will be submitted to National.

4. Submission used in service-related contest entries cannot be entered in the Community Affairs Scrapbook Contest

Contest Rules are adapted from the National Community Affairs Commission rules which were approved at the Fall 1980 meeting of the National Executive Committee, and revised at the Fall 1989 meeting of the National Executive Committee, the Sons of The American Legion.

AMERICANISM

Mark Pape, Commander of Squadron 294 Hartland reported on their February 2022 Sleepover for Homeless Veterans. This was the 3rd year they held this event.

In 2020 they had a goal to raise \$5,000. They raised \$20,000. The following year in 2021, amidst the pandemic, they raised \$39,000. This year they raised \$57,000, plus they filled a box truck with donated clothes, furniture, shoes, boots, food. Here is how they distributed the funds:

- \$27,000 Tiny Houses of Racine Veterans Outreach of Wisconsin
- \$27,000 Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative – West Allis – Statewide organization

In addition to the sleepover event, the squadron conducts Poker Runs, Gun Raffles, Pancakes w/ Santa, Softball tournaments, and Corn bag tournaments

Squadron 209 Orfordville also held a sleepover for homeless veterans. This was their first year and they raised \$39,000. They disbursed their funds in the attached Freezin for a Reason report.

Detachment Historian Mike Pook created two books of the two events. Cover on the book is from an Americanism coloring contest.

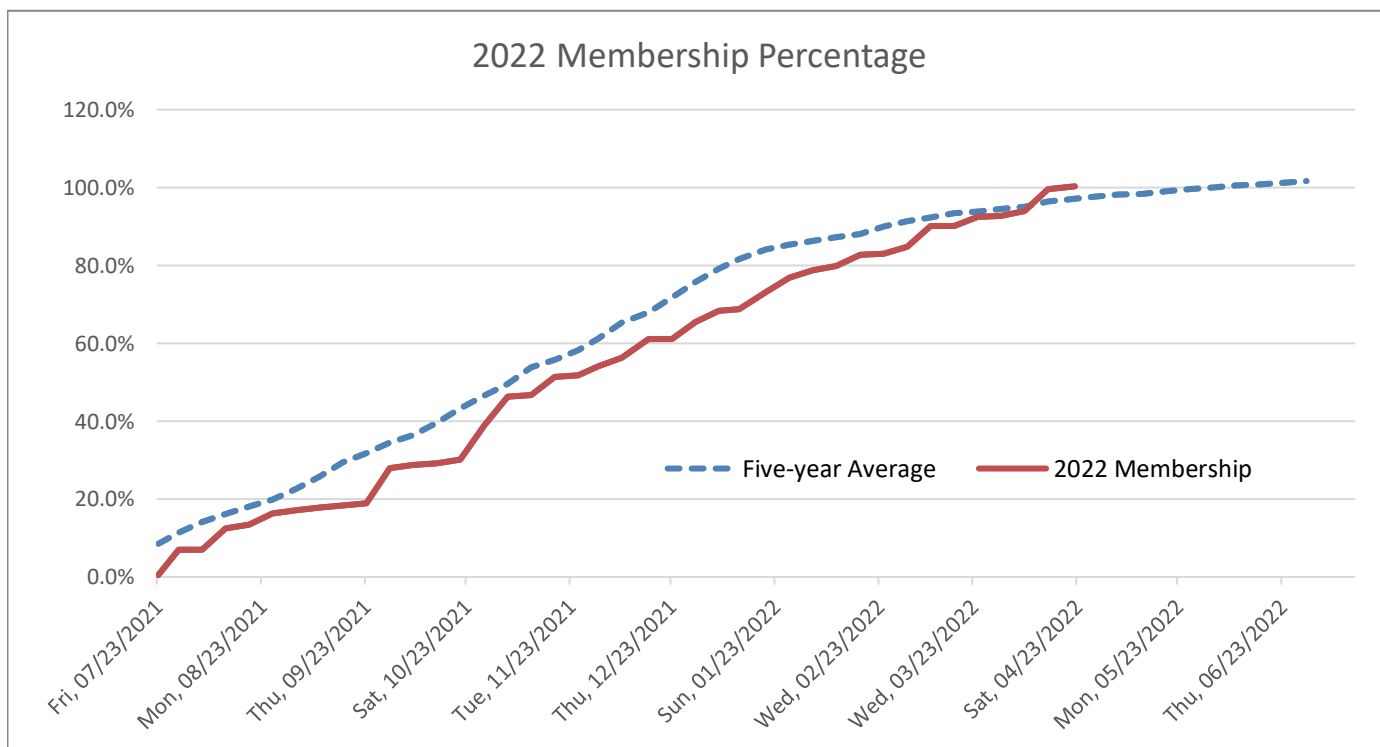

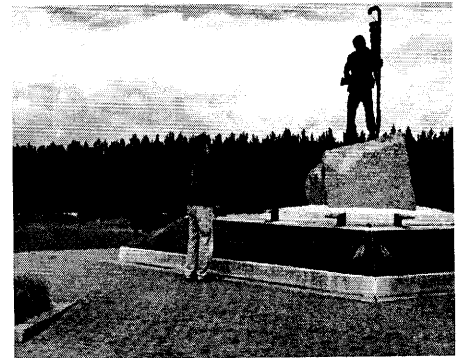

Title: Amending Uniform Code of Procedures for Conventions

Whereas: The following amendment(s) to the SONS OF THE AMERICAN LEGION DETACHMENT OF WISCONSIN UNIFORM CODE OF PROCEEDURE FOR CONVENTIONS, here to fore referred to as the as the “CODE” are meant to streamline the voting procedure for all attendees, Squadron and Dual Members, et. al.; NOW THEREFORE BE IT

Resolved: by the Detachment Executive Committee of the Sons of The American Legion, Detachment of Wisconsin assembled on the 23rd day of April 2022 in the city of Portage, Wisconsin, that Article VIII. Standing Rules of the Convention, rules 20 and 21 be changed from:

20. The election of Detachment Officers and National Convention Delegates and Alternates shall take place starting at 12:00 p.m. on Saturday of the convention. Elections shall be Special Order of Business, not to be interrupted by any other order of business. Presentations of guest speakers shall be at the discretion of the Detachment Commander.
21. Prior to the election of Detachment Officers, the Detachment Commander shall appoint, subject to the approval of the convention, a judge of elections and such number of tellers as he deems necessary, provided that the total number of tellers is an odd number. In a contested election, each candidate going to the ballot shall be entitled to one teller of his choice. The judge of elections and the tellers shall be members of the Sons of The American Legion or The American Legion.

To:

20. The Elections shall be a Special Order of Business. The election of Detachment Officers and National Convention Delegates and Alternates shall commence at such time as the role of Qualified Squadron Delegates commences on Saturday of the Convention. At such time, each Delegate will be issued a (one, single) ballot for that Delegate. All ballots shall be completed at the SAL Voting Table and returned to the Elections Committee. Ballot(s) may not leave the SAL Convention Room. Voting will conclude prior to the start of the Afternoon Session of the Convention, that same Day. Election Results will be Declared at such time as deemed by the Elections Committee, that same Day. In the event of a runoff election, the same procedure will be followed with balloting.

21. Prior to the election of Detachment Officers, the Detachment Commander shall appoint, subject to the approval of the convention, a judge of elections and such number of tellers as he deems necessary, provided that the total number of tellers is an odd number. In a contested election, each candidate going to the ballot shall be entitled to one observer of his choice. The judge of elections, tellers and observer(s) shall be members of the Sons of The American Legion or The American Legion.
