SAL Detachment of WI Spring DEC National Homeland Security Report April 26th, 2025

Greetings to the members of the Sal of Wi and guests. I have the following to mention to you today.

Each Year the AL Dept of WI NHS committee selects a National Guard Reservist, EMT / Firefighter, Legislator and Educator of The Year. Let us try to help them out by promoting these awards at our Squadron or District meetings. On average there are not a lot of candidates submitted. We all know someone who falls into each of these areas. All requirements are in the Department Administrative Manual. I hope you may have heard of a submission or two this year. I have sadly not. All submissions were do to the Districts by April 1st and are due to Department by May 1st. Please assist your perspective home post and District next year.

I have the following to report concerning our POW / MIA.

In accordance with the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency our total missing stands at 84,604 as of 1973. There are 3,477 that have been accounted for leaving 81,127 to find and identify. World War II had 73,679 missing as of 1973 with 1,701 identified and 71,978 still unaccounted for.

The Korean War had 8,137 missing with 713 identified and 7,444 yet to be accounted for. The Vietnam War had 2,634 missing, with 1,061 identified, and leaving 1,573 left to find and identify as of 1973.

The Cold War had 128 missing as of 1973 with 2 identified and 128 still accounted for. The Gulf War and Libya Operations have had 6 missing with none accounted for. On average we identify from 12 to 17 individuals each month. We will never forget, and we will never stop searching.

Scouting is also an area that I am interested in and involved in. I guess you could say this a plug for this youth organization. Eagle Scout of the year nominations are due to Department HQ by March

1st, The recipient receives a \$1000.00 scholarship if selected. Please promote this program if you know of an Eagle Scout that is 18 years old or younger. Administrative manual. This is a very prestigious award that can be earned by Scout leaders. This is a tough animal to receive as the requirements are many but we usually present at least one each year. This is a big PLEASE. Scouts need service hours to advance in rank. If you know of a Scouting pack or Troop in your area have them help at one of your SAL Squadron or District events and remember you can always mention Camp American Legion to them as there always something needed there.

The 2025 Eagle Scout of the Year for our Department has been chosen. This years recipient is James J Lange from Shawano. James was sponsored by Shawano American Legion Post 117. His project was putting in a GaGa Ball pit in the playground at St. James Lutheran School. You may ask what is gaga ball?

Gaga ball, or Octo-ball, is an exciting variation of dodgeball where players stand inside an octagonal pit and try hitting each other with a ball. If a player gets hit below the waist or knees, they're out of the game and the last person standing wins.

Well, all in all there were three submissions for this award this time around. One of them was the recipient's brother that had the same project. It all came down in the end to cumulative scores and there was a 1.5-point difference.

Please remember to fundraise whenever possible. Our Department National Homeland Security Committee needs help with raising monies for the Troop and Family Support part of their mission.
