--Establish and maintain a network of fellow NEC men and Senior Leadership as mentors as well as a source for answers/direction. Be prepared to be a mentor as well.

--Provide a list of Detachment members traveling to the Fall & Spring NEC meetings to National. Schedule training as needed.

- Identify members who plan on attending the Fall NEC meeting and notify the Adjutant by the Detachment Convention.

- Identify members who plan on attending the Spring NEC and notify the Adjutant by the Mid-Winter Conference. The Adjutant will then forward this information to the National Liaison for room assignments and means of travel.

- Serve as the primary host for dignitaries visiting your Detachment for various events by arranging transportation, hospitality, and if necessary, lodging for them.
- Prior to the visit, set expectations and provide the visiting dignitary with an outline or itinerary of activities scheduled during their visit.

National Appointments

The Detachment leadership receives a notification requesting nominations for appointments to national positions. Distribution and notification to the general membership is based upon each individual Detachment's operating procedures which should mimic the parent organization. The NEC is responsible to interview and insure those interested in National appointment or training event meet all requirements and are qualified and prepared to fulfill the position or appointment they are seeking. The recommendations for National positions are endorsed by the NEC and forward to the Department for further endorsement and sent to the appropriate office of the National organization.



ROLES, RESPONSIBILITIES & EXPECTATIONS OF THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEEMAN

National Appointments

--In most cases, members who serve on the National level are recommended to stay in their current appointment, unless they express, they do not want to stay on, or it has been demonstrated that the member is not representing your Detachment in an honorable fashion. A member who is not participating as required or if another member is deemed more suitable the Detachment can recommend the new member be appointed.

--Commission appointments are valid for three (3) years, Committee appointments are valid for one (1) year. Letters of recommendation are held for one (1) year.
